The PSAT 8/9 will be administered to all freshmen on October 12th in preparation for the NMSQT which is used for scholarships later in the high school career.

As a reminder, you'll need 50 hours of community service as part of your graduation requirements and it's best to get started during your freshman year. Stop by the Guidance Office for a form to track your hours and submit any forms to Mrs. Carvalho in the Main Office.


POWERSCHOOL
